This relationship helped us continue to improve quality of care, the patient's experience, and lowered the cost of healthcare in the Roanoke Valley.

We continue to move your Medical Center from a focus on the volume of sick care to the value of healthcare. This shift from volume to value requires patients and families to

develop their roles in a trusting relationship with their primary care provider. In this relationship, primary care providers will guide patients through accidents, illnesses, and a focus on healthy behaviors.

Primary care providers will represent patients for their use of specialists and surgeons. Having the right specialists in the community ensures that needed services are within reach of patients who need them. Healthcare will be more convenient with local access and greater patient satisfaction.

To keep patients engaged in their care, they need resources to manage their health. Last year, Halifax Regional brought consumers improved connectivity to manage their health through the HalifaxHealthLink patient online portal, providing secure online access to their personal health record around the clock.

In 2014, we extended our reach to the community in partnership with other local organizations to positively help residents adopt a healthy lifestyle. With the generous support of the Kate B. Reynolds Charitable Trust, we partnered in the community-wide campaign "Get Fit, Stay Fit Roanoke Valley." This was a program of the Roanoke Valley Community Health Initiative to address child obesity and empower healthy lifestyles.

Halifax Regional continues to be a strong driver for health in the Roanoke Valley. Our physicians, staff, volunteers, and Board of Directors understand the needs of our region. - Recruited a new Manager for Facility Services, John Otterbourg.
- Appointed our second Executive Liaison, Tiffany Mose. Tiffany completed a referring physician survey to improve communications with the Hospitalist service and is currently working to analyze primary care referral patterns.
- Our volunteers continue to play a vital role in the mission of Halifax Regional by helping patients, visitors, and employees

within the Medical Center. The program grew by ten new volunteers in 2014, bringing the total to 61 volunteers. This group provided over 10,280 hours of service last year. Additionally, the auxiliary awarded \$2,000 in college scholarships and \$600 to two high school health science programs. One volunteer even crochets baby hats for the newborn babies at our Birthing Center.

SERVICES & TECHNOLOGY

Providing our community with comprehensive, cutting-edge diagnostic equipment, high-tech procedures, a state-of the-art facility, and improved services is vital to ensure patient and employee safety.

- Information Systems implemented a security alert system on all network PCs to immediately notify employees of emergency situations.
- Replaced both radiologic ultrasound machines with new models.
- Provided physicians and other providers with mobile device access to online radiology films and reports.
- Implemented electronic medical record and billing systems software at Halifax Works.
- Upgraded and replaced all intravenous (I.V.) pumps throughout the hospital.
- Implemented e-PharmPro for improved pharmacy quality and lower cost for patients.
- Implemented the Follow-My-Health clinical patient information portal, allowing for online access to patients' personal health records 24/7 securely and safely.
- Received state approval for three Behavioral Health Emergency Department beds to double the number of available beds. Also added a shower for long-stay patients and a separate nursing station.

- Developed and implemented a new Nursing Care model that increased by 27% the amount of time for direct patient care.

COMMUNITY

Halifax Regional is committed to keeping you, your family, and your neighbors healthy. By working together, we can continue to make our community a healthier place to live, now and into the future.



- Provided over 20 free breast cancer screenings at Roanoke Clinic in conjunction with Roanoke Valley Breast Cancer Coalition (RVBCC). The RVBCC also received the Spirit of Impact award from the Komen Foundation.
- Collaborated with Halifax County and Economic Development Services to create an economic impact assessment of the Medical Center. The study revealed an annual impact of \$152 million on the community, and that 1,252 direct, indirect, and induced jobs were supported by the Halifax Regional Medical Center.



- Employee fundraising campaigns raised over \$85,456 for the United Way, Relay for Life, and the Halifax Regional Foundation.
- Developed and launched a "Healthy Lifestyles" website. Working with nursing, dieticians, and health educators, the site supports

 Added two partners to the Hotel 'Give Back' Program. These partners benefit the Halifax Regional Foundation by donating five dollars per room night for reservations booked for Medical Center-related purposes.



 Received a grant of \$622,509 from the Kate B. Reynolds Charitable Trust on behalf of The Roanoke Valley Community Health Initiative (RV-CHI) to launch "Get Fit, Stay Fit Roanoke

Valley"— a campaign to promote healthy eating and active living among children, families and individuals in Halifax and Northampton Counties. The campaign is a comprehensive, five-year effort to engage residents across the two





counties through education, physical activity and recreation at local parks, in addition to improved access to healthy food and workplace wellness projects.

 Planned and participated in State legislative lobbying to support Medicaid patients in Halifax and Northampton Counties.

The Birthing Center also received the Infant Safe Sleep Model of Excellence Award from the NC Healthy Start Foundation.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

In 2014, Halifax Regional experienced a .092% operating profit of \$816,770. This follows 2013, in which the Medical Center generated a loss of 1,378,784. The primary reason for the profit in 2014 was a decrease in wages. Charity care was \$11,376,633, and bad debt was \$14,751,994. Healthcare reform and declining reimbursements from Medicare and Medicaid continue to make financial planning a challenge.


